Dove made a motion to approve the agenda. Cheek seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Barrett made a motion to approve the September minutes. McFarlin seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Dove made a motion to deny the rezone application request from Cody Grizzle. McFarlin seconded the motion. Dove, McFarlin and Cheek voted in favor of the motion. Barrett abstained. Motion passed.

Cheek made a motion to adopt the Franklin County Hazard Mitigation Plan 2025-2030 resolution. Barrett seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Dove made a motion to accept the bid from Gary Roberts regarding the demolition of the old hut and trailer behind the city park. Barrett seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Cheek made a motion to approve the Task Order Contract with EMI regarding the Hull Ave well. Barrett seconded and motion passed unanimously.

McFarlin made a motion to approve a moratorium regarding residential and commercial development requiring water service availability. This will extend the current moratorium through February 3, 2026. Dove seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Dove made a motion to table the discussion of shelter fees at the city park. Barrett seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Cheek made a motion to approve moving forward with the city hall repairs. Dove seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Dove made a motion to appoint David Ayers to the Planning and Zoning Board to finish the term of Phil Whitlow. Barrett seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Holbrook gave an update on the grant award from Georgia Power Legacy Project for \$10,000.00 to be used towards park improvements.
